Course description:

Advanced Diploma in Interior Design and Décor (ADIDD) is designed in response to our basic diploma participants' perpetual question – what next is there for me? It is neither a repeat nor an extension of the basic diploma but the next level of input, training and practice to further a promising career in the field of interior design. The six months diploma program will give the participants a comprehensive overview of the field through various practical projects supported by instructor presentations and feedback. Students will develop an insight of the design process and necessary skill to work on a small scale to mid-scale projects.

Participants will learn the elements of design, survey a space, select colors and materials, learn technical, free-hand drawing, digital drawing, produce mood and sample boards and prepare a portfolio of work. In order to fully benefit from the course you should engage with the project and complete the assignments and all sessions.

Course Overview:

Advance Interior Décor and Design: It will give the participants a comprehensive overview of the field through various practical projects supported by instructor presentations and feedback, students will develop an insight of the design process and necessary skill to work on a small scale to mid-scale projects.

Who should take this course?

This course is ideal for students who have a serious interest in the field of interior décor and design and want to learn the components of the field and be aware of the current trends of interior décor and styling. Individuals considering further study will also benefit from it.

Entry requirements: Prior educational background in design is a must. You could have a Basic diploma in interior design and décor, Bachelors in Architecture, Bachelors in Interior Design, Bachelors in Textile Design, Bachelors in Fine/Visual Arts or any other diploma/degree in design education.

Level: Advance (intermediate level)



COURSE COMPONENTS

1. Interior Design Theory:

This module will help them to understand different theories and philosophy on interior décor and design. The module will set a theoretical base to understand design projects. The process of turning ideas into interiors, you build a vocabulary for explaining your designs clearly and powerfully. The instructor will introduce design theories, developed by design masters like *Frank Lloyd Wright, Louis Kahn, and Alvar Alto etc.*

Weekly themes for exploring your creative process include how interiors are experienced, methods of transforming complex problems into dynamic designs. Slide-illustrated lectures and discussions help you develop an awareness of the basic principles of design and aesthetics by studying the work of past and present designers and architects.

1.1 Elements of Interior Design

This module is divided into 3 main components

Color, lighting and Materials-furnishings

The color module will cover the main elements of interior design alongside material and site visits. The color module will cover the color theory, Research, analyze and apply color for interior spaces and build up the foundation of color application and use. Lighting is the integral part of interior design. This module will closely analyze the types of lighting needed for the residential and commercial spaces, techniques of lighting design and selection of light fittings will be discussed briefly. Materials and finishes module is based on the understanding of soft and hard materials used in interior spaces. Theory classes are paired with material lab visits and demonstration of materials use. Finishes will also include the use of drapery and upholstery in furniture design. Students will prepare materials boards for client presentation and recommend soft furnishings for given interior projects.

3. Drawing and rendering:

In this specially designed module the student learns how to develop and refine a range of techniques to produce technical and conceptual drawings. The student explores the way design drawing, both technical and concept, can be applied to interior decoration and design, where visual representation is required. The student will learn how to make technical drawings and details for a small to medium scale project. Both manual and digital methods and techniques are explored.

4. Advance Interior Design and Décor:

The student learns how to develop decorating schemes for residential and commercial interiors in accordance with project briefs. During the subject the student learns how to analyze a design brief, conduct research and generate decoration ideas and concepts to create a visual experience in a previously defined interior space. The student learns how to select materials and finishes for surface decoration and to arrange the objects and elements within the space. The studio project ranges from residential units to small scale commercial design. This module will be offer for two months

In the final major project the students will be given the opportunity to develop their own individual style and approach through the instigation and development of your own project brief enabling you to focus your skills and orient yourself towards a specific area of the interior design industry.

- 1. Residential interior
- 2. Commercial interiors
